Key to Survey Scoring: For each set of questions tabulate your score using the following numerical values. The scoring is weighted with the “neutral” NS answer being a negative score, because if you are uncertain on one of these matters then you are not receiving the benefit God wants to provide for you.

CD – Negative 3 points

SD – Negative 2 points

NS – Negative 1 point

SA – Positive 1 points

CA – Positive 2 points

If your total score...

...**matches or exceeds the total number of questions**, then this is an area of strength.

...**is less than the total number of questions**, then this area could use attention or refinement.

...**is a negative number**, then this area should be given immediate and concentrated attention.

- Questions 1-5: (Total: _____ in 5 questions)

This set of questions examines “**the core beliefs of gospel generosity.**” Every spoke of the gospel wheel begins with knowing who God is, who we are, and what life is about. Unless we root our activities in how the Bible defines these “big questions of life” our activity will either be motivated by guilt, produce pride, or never feel like “enough.”

- Questions 6-10: (Total: _____ in 5 questions)

This set of questions examines “**the character necessary for generosity.**” Unless we embrace certain core values of Scripture, generosity will become a point of grumbling or resentment. Unless we trust God and accept what He calls “good” as good, then we are likely to see generosity as “unfair.”

- Questions 11-15: (Total: _____ in 5 questions)

This set of questions examines “**the preparation for consistent generosity.**” In order for generosity to become a lifestyle it must be rooted in a life with well-established wisdom structures. Without preparation and realistic expectations for your time and money, generosity can become an emotional reaction to big needs or causes that may not be sustainable long-term.

- Questions 16-20: (Total: _____ in 5 questions)

This set of questions examines “**the intentionality of wise generosity.**” One of God’s intended effects for our generosity is to compel us to get to know where He is working, who He is working through, and what He is doing. The research phase of generosity is an expedition for places God is doing and wants to do great things.

- Questions 21-25: (Total: _____ in 5 questions)

This set of questions examines “**the involvement that should accompany generosity.**” Generosity that is only about money is truncated generosity. Our generosity should echo the words of Paul, “Being so affectionately desirous of you, we were ready to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you had become very dear to us (1 Thes 2:8).”

- Questions 26-30: (Total: _____ in 5 questions)

This set of questions examines “**the effects of generosity upon the giver.**” Generosity is a fruit of the gospel that produces more fruit in us. When we look for the impact of our generosity we should not only look outside ourselves (at others who were blessed), but inside ourselves (at the changes God produced in us).
